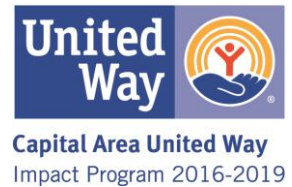

2018 Programs and Services

The Child and Family Counseling Center provides clinical services to children, individuals and families who need help in finding solutions to a wide range of emotional, behavioral and relationship problems. We have trained experts in alcohol/ drug abuse issues, parenting issues and family conflict/ violence issues. Services are provided on a sliding fee scale without excluding anyone due to income.

Domestic Abuse Intervention Groups provide 52 weeks of counseling to perpetrators of violence by offering education, coping skills and support to help prevent recidivism of offense.

Family Safe Haven provides counseling and emergency financial assistance to protect and serve victims of domestic violence.



Ryan White Part A Program- Care Coordination, resources and programs that enhance health and well being. This program assists with financial assistance, transportation, emergencies, utilities and medication.



HIV Women & Children programs help clients access services, resources and programs that enhance health and well being. Services include: case management, support groups, counseling, health/treatment education, financial education, transportation, childcare, financial assistance toward rent, mortgage, utilities, medication, eye and dental care. All services are free.



HIV, Counseling, Testing & Linkage to Care- combines HIV education, counseling, testing and referral services aimed at prevention, early identification of the HIV infection and linkage to medical care.



ViiV Positive Action Initiative - Provides intensive case management services for formerly incarcerated individuals who are HIV positive. Services are designed to assist individuals with linkage to care, medical adherence and supportive services.



National Leadership Commission on AIDS and Positive Action 4 Woman program is to educate and advocate the expansion of opportunities for HIV/STI/HCV testing, treatment/care, community outreach, health education, awareness and information sharing.

United States Probation and Parole Mental Health Treatment provides mental health assessment, treatment, psychiatric evaluation and medication management for individuals with mental health and substance abuse issues.

Supervised Visitation Program serves the needs of families who are directed by Family Court to make arrangements for visits between noncustodial parents and their children.

The Parenting Center promotes healthy family development by providing ongoing workshops, consultations and classes to help parents increase their knowledge, skills and decision making in the important role of effective parenting. The program offers parenting classes and professional workshops for parents, teachers and community groups focused on child development, strategies for effective parenting and a variety of classes that teach proactive methods to promote healthy social emotional growth in children.
